

La Salle Primary School
Primary One Admission for September 2024 (Application for Discretionary Places)

- I. La Salle Primary School ('the School') is an aided school following the Education Bureau's admission procedures.
- II. The School is a whole-day primary school. There are 6 classes in each grade (36 classes in total).
- III. Approved Charges for Non-standard Items (ACNI): In the academic year 2023-2024, the fee for ACNI is \$3,100 (per year) per student.
- IV. Application Dates & Time:

** Parents/guardian should **NOT** submit duplicate applications via ePOA and in paper form for the same child.

- VI. For parents/guardians who submit paper application form in person, they are required to bring along the following documents:

(For details, please refer to Notes on How to Complete the 'Application Form for Admission to Primary One'.)

Original items:

1. Parent/guardian's (should be the same as the signee on the application form) Identity Card, Passport or other identity documents. (If the parent/guardian cannot come in person, his/her representative should present an authorisation form and a photocopy of the parent/guardian's identity document.)
2. The completed "Application Form for Admission to Primary One" in triplicate.

3. Applicant child's Birth Certificate
 - Hong Kong Identity Card cannot be used alone as the identity document. If the 'Status of permanent resident of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region' in the last column of the Birth Certificate is 'Not Established', his travel document(s) or Permit to Remain in Hong Kong are required.
 - In the absence of a Hong Kong Birth Certificate, the parent/guardian should bring along the applicant child's original Birth Certificate (non-local) and document(s) permitting him to stay in Hong Kong.
4. Parent/guardian's residential address proof
 - The name on the residential address proof should be that of the parent/guardian. Proof of residential address includes but not limited to tenancy agreement (stamped and/or with stamp certificate), demand note for rates, public housing tenancy agreement (whole set) or water / electricity / town gas / residential telephone / fixed broadband bills (electronic bills are also accepted), initial deposit for bill must be submitted with payment record.
 - The above documents must be the most updated one issued by the company. The name of the registered user, telephone number and address should be clearly shown on the residential telephone / fixed broadband bill.
 - **The Education Bureau will not accept mobile phone bills, bank statements or insurance policy documents.**
 - If the parent is the signee, but the name on the residential address proof belongs to the applicant child's grandparent, the Birth Certificate of the applicant child's parent should be presented.
5. Claiming the applicant child's brother is studying in the School (if applicable)
 - Birth Certificate of the applicant child's brother
 - The Student Handbook (2023-2024) of the applicant child's brother (Page 1 of the Student Handbook)
6. Claiming the applicant child's father was a graduate of the School (if applicable)
 - Graduate Certificate, Secondary 1 Admission Slip or P.6 second term report card of the applicant child's father (P.6 Student Handbook **will not be accepted**)
7. Claiming the applicant child's brother was a graduate of the School (if applicable)
 - Birth Certificate of the applicant child's brother
 - Graduate Certificate, Secondary 1 Admission Slip or P.6 second term report card of the applicant child's brother (P.6 Student Handbook **will not be accepted**)
8. Being a Catholic
 - Baptism Certificate of the applicant child (where a document is not in Chinese or English, it must be accompanied by a Chinese or English translation certified as a true translation by an authorised translator.)

Digitalisation of Primary One Admission (POA)

In line with the “Smart Government” strategy, the Education Bureau (EDB) has fully implemented digitalisation of POA. Parents can choose to submit applications for discretionary places and central allocation, as well as check results of allocation of discretionary places and central allocation via the POA e-Platform (ePOA) (URL: <https://epoa.edb.gov.hk/login?lang=en> or scan the QR code on the right) in the following dates:

Parents who have bound their accounts to “iAM Smart+” can submit primary one applications and check the results of allocation of discretionary places and central allocation through e-Platform. Parents who have bound their accounts to “iAM Smart” can check the results through the e-Platform.
